What is the actual value of semantic contextualisation, and could that not be produced by search engines?

What should Europeana do to enhance the object view (item page) to engage users to explore and discover the cultural diversity of the aggregated data? How should these contexts be visualized, and should the user be allowed to add groupings of information?

How important is multilingual access for discovery in Europeana, and which elements are most important: cross-lingual search, semantic browsing of categories (e.g. names and places), or translation of the object metadata and content?

Can Europeana drive end-user engagement on the distributed sites and services of contributing archives?
